



Commonwealth get Heath's full text

Khrushchev drops pressure on Finland

THE crisis between Russia and Finland, which had been causing increasing concern in the West, is over. It has ended with a compromise which preserves Finnish independence and neutrality.

Russia has agreed to shelve her demand for talks on joint military measures with Finland against an alleged West German threat in the Baltic.

The Finns have reassured the Russians that their neutrality policy will remain unchanged. The withdrawal of President Kekkonen's chief electoral rival has made it virtually certain that the present Finnish leader will remain in power.

An official Soviet statement yesterday said that in Friday's talks between President Kekkonen and Mr. Khrushchev at Novosibirsk, Siberia, the Soviet Government had found it possible to put off for the time being the proposed military consultations.

Consult Russia if necessary

The statement said that President Kekkonen, while accepting that Soviet arguments about possible war in Europe were well grounded, had pointed out that consultations might lead to a Scandinavian war psychosis. If the Soviet Union did not insist on consultations, this would "decrease the necessity of war preparations not only in Finland and Sweden but also in the NATO countries, Norway and Denmark."

Mr. Khrushchev expressed belief in President Kekkonen's ability to keep peace and strengthen Finland's neutrality policy. He hoped the Finnish Government would "attentively follow developments in the Northern Europe and Baltic Sea area" and consult Russia in case of any developments.

The Soviet statement underlines the role played by the cautious but resolute attitude of the other Scandinavian countries. Norway and Denmark had made it clear that, though they would avoid provocation, they would not be frightened out of their NATO commitments. Denmark, in particular, was not deterred from concluding an agreement on the formation of a joint Danish-West German military command under NATO — from accepting a West German naval command in the Baltic.

Soviet fear of a shift to NATO

The Soviet pressure seems to have been inspired by the general nerve war over Berlin and also by fears of a shift throughout Scandinavia into closer alignment with Western Europe. Inside Finland the five-party coalition formed to oppose President Kekkonen was regarded by the Russians as a move towards an anti-Communist front.

To overcome Russian suspicions, the five-party coalition opposing President Kekkonen in the Presidential elections, Dr. Honka, withdrew on Friday from the contest "for the good of the fatherland."

President Kekkonen spent yesterday in Moscow and left by train last night for Helsinki. At lunch with President Brezhnev and three Soviet Deputy Premiers, President Kekkonen said: "Prime Minister Khrushchev has displayed now, as always, before a great understanding of Finland's attitude and wishes."

Our Helsinki Correspondent writes: Helsinki took today's common sense. The people received news of the removal of the immediate threat of military negotiations with Russia with relief. Political circles are more reserved. They allow that immediate pressure has been eased, but say nothing has been settled, and say so. Diplomats are still there.

Canada pleased

A VERBATIM report of the Common Market speech made in Paris last month by Mr. Edward Heath, the Lord Privy Seal, is now being made available in confidence to Commonwealth Governments and to the members of the European Free Trade Association.

A Government statement through the Foreign Office last night said that the decision to release the full text followed consultation with the six Common Market countries.

This, said the statement, is "an exception to the arrangement that working documents should be confidential to the seven Governments taking part in negotiations and the Commission of the European Economic Community."

The decision had been taken because of "persistent reports" that Mr. Heath's text had come into the possession of some Governments which are not parties to the Common Market negotiations.

Mr. Heath's speech was given at a private meeting of the Council of Ministers of the Six. The Government statement said: "No copies have at any time been made available by H.M. Government to any other Government."

A substantial portion of this statement dealt with United Kingdom domestic affairs. A detailed written summary of the parts affecting the Commonwealth was communicated to Commonwealth Governments shortly before the Lord Privy Seal made his speech. At the same time a detailed written summary of the parts affecting members of the European Free Trade Association was communicated to their Governments.

Questions in the Commons

The statement followed reports that the Canadian Government, after having been refused a full text of the speech by Britain, had learned that a full text in the possession of the Commonwealth was communicated to Commonwealth Governments shortly before the Lord Privy Seal made his speech. At the same time a detailed written summary of the parts affecting members of the European Free Trade Association was communicated to their Governments.

What is at stake

Discussing industry's attitude to the pause Mr. Lloyd said: "In general I believe the pause is so obvious in the interests not only of the country as a whole but of the wage-earners, the purchasing power of whose wages is at stake, that those with responsibility will continue to realise this and to cooperate."

The Chancellor, who was addressing the half-yearly meeting of the North-West Provincial Area Council of the Conservative Party, said he regretted a further postponement of the TUC's decision to join his new Council for National Economic Development.

He said he would be meeting the Economic Committee of the TUC on Tuesday to discuss again the TUC's possible adherence to his Council for Economic Development.

Almost as the Chancellor was talking, leaders of the country's telephone maintenance men threatened that their members might work to rule in protest against the pay pause.

G.P.O. men's threat

Announcing this in London yesterday, Mr. Charles Smith, general secretary of the Post Office Engineering Union, said that the effect of any action would be a gradual slowing down of telephone repairs and installation work for new subscribers.

Mr. Smith said a "crisis" had arisen in the union's relations with the Post Office, which had handled in a "completely unfair way" a claim the union had tabled in November 1960.

Members were beginning to get only the 51 per cent. increases which had been rejected by the union. The balance of the tribunal's award (2 per cent. more in the case of most workers) was being withheld until the end of the pay pause and would then be paid without retrospective effect.

The National Committee representing the 120,000 power station employees who recently received a pay rise after threatening to "black out" the country at Christmas decided in London yesterday that in the New Year they would go ahead for a "normal" wage increase.

A statement issued after the meeting said the electricity workers had scored a "victory" in their dispute with the Government's wage freeze policy.

This was said to have been achieved by the Government's decision to allow a 1 per cent. increase in the wages of power station workers.
